HONOUR ROLL REQUIREMENTS:

GR. 9 HONOURS – Average of 80-89% in all 5 cores (Language Arts – French & English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Physical Education (Cooperation Component), including complementary courses

GR. 9 HONOURS WITH DISTINCTION – Average of 90% or higher in all 5 cores (Language Arts – French & English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Physical Education (Cooperation Component), including complementary courses

GR. 7 & 8 OCELOT SILVER AWARDS - Recipients of these awards require a minimum of all 5 cores (Language Arts – French & English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Physical Education (*Cooperation Component*) at Proficient including Comp courses.

GR. 7 & 8 OCELOT GOLD AWARDS - Recipients of these awards require a minimum 4 out of 5 cores (Language Arts – French & English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Physical Education (*Cooperation Component*) at Mastery and no less than Proficient in all others including Comp Courses.

COURSE SPECIFIC AWARDS:

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AWARD

This Athletic award is presented to the student(s) who continually demonstrates a keen desire to excel in a variety of sports and fitness activities. The award acknowledges those individuals who have earned recognition through excellence in physical activities and leadership. They have a willingness to learn cognitively about sports and they demonstrate an initiative and a commitment to excellence. This individual maintains an enthusiastic attitude towards fitness and sports and displays a high level of effort and work ethic in Physical Education classes as well as extra-curricular activities.

(Award(s) given at each grade level & 1 or more students may receive this award)

Selection decision is up to the individual teacher(s), not necessarily the highest mark.

COMPLIMENTARY COURSE AWARDS: (Semestered Courses)

Dance, Digital Art & Design, Foods, FSD Sport Academy (Hockey), Guitar, Science and Technology, Spanish, Textiles, Wildlife, Woodworking.

(Award(s) given at each grade level & 1 or more students may receive this award)

Selection decision is up to the individual teachers, not necessarily the highest mark.

FINE ARTS AWARDS: (Year Long Courses)

Concert Band, Jazz Band, Choir, Art, Drama, Awards (when it is offered in regular timetable)

Selection decision is up to the individual teachers, not necessary the highest mark.

OTHER AWARDS:

STUDENT COUNCIL RECOGNITION

This award goes to a member or members of council that is a positive encouraging member that consistently took a leadership role in council. They also participated in the majority of the Student Council Activities

Selection made by Student Council Advisors – not always presented

(1 or more students may receive this award)

CITIZENSHIP AWARD

Student has a positive attitude; caring and concerned about others; actively involved in the school; puts forth consistently good effort in all areas of study.

Selection decision is up to the individual Home Room Teachers

(Award(s) given at each grade level & 1 or more students may receive this award)

MEMORIAL / NAMED AWARDS:

MURRAY CLARKE ATHLETIC AWARD

Given to the Top Female and Male all-around athlete. Positive attitude, sportsmanlike behaviour; leadership in school athletics; participates in several interscholastic sports; demonstrates versatility in sport; a great ambassador for our school. This award recognizes the dedication to athletics shown by Murray Clarke during his teaching career at ÉOJHS.

The recipients will be determined by the PE Department and any Coaches that coached the individual.

JOLAN YUHA ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AWARD

The student may be a boy or girl from grade seven, eight, or nine. This student demonstrates a passion for “all things language arts”! The recipient will be determined by the English Language Arts Teachers *NOTE: This should not be based on marks.*

PAT PALMER AWARD

Student is able to maintain a passing grade through consistent, industrious effort; demonstrates an ongoing commitment to learning and shows a sincere desire to the “best that he/she can be”.

PERCY PEGLER AWARD

Senior Student - Positive attitude; caring and concerned about others; shows leadership in student activities; strong academic performance and athletic ability; demonstrates sportsmanlike qualities during competitive events; actively involved in and around the school. (Top overall student in the school)
